10/27/2011	Sadly it is my opinion that both condensed versions have kept many of the poorest recommendations of all four combined and quite frankly do a great disservice to the Southend districts in their deliberations and how to respond. Too much Seattle control is stretched too far South in the 37th by including Tukwila. Moving Burien under the control of the 33rd makes this district too far afield to manage (as if the 5th does not have their own issues vertically !!) at the same time running the 11th like a wedge thru the middle of Kent and splitting it and aligning a larger portion with Renton and points north where it has little in common. I am looking at both of these proposals at the same time and concentrating on the South end obviously (Lake Washington to the King County border with the GOOLE EARTH IMAGE when making observations as it defines the hard borders....) Align the 11th to include Tukwila and move the bottom line for the 11th back to at the very least 192nd at the furthest South and preferably back to the Renton City limits proper . Give Burien back to the 34th. Kent is the 6th largest city in the state but is being sliced up like luncheon meat. Seattle Proper is comprised of 5 or so distinct Districts, Kent has become a Dagwood sandwich.... My recommendations make for a horizontal approach to community districting, and removes much of the vertical dynamics of crossing many communities that existed previously in the districting maps. Seattle needs to be completely out of the South Ends business model, the 37th including Tukwila is outlandish in that reach when it should be in the 11th if a change is needed from the 33rd in which it resides now. I have Kaiser, Upthegrove and Orwall all living in Des Moines, this current plan will only strengthen their base here to the point of monopoly. Change is inevitable here , that is a given, but IF this is the best they got for us to deal with after all these months I AM VERY DISAPPOINTED?
