



General Description of Proposed Congressional Districts

Bellevue District

This is the Eastside district. In its far northwest it includes Shoreline, Lake Forest Park, and Kenmore, but not Bothell. In its far southwest, it includes Renton. Its northern boundary is Snohomish County except for the portion of Bothell and its PAA in King County. Its eastern boundary, in general terms, is SR 203, SR 202 and SR 18. Its southern boundary is, more or less, SE 192nd St, Maple Valley Highway, and the southern boundary of Renton. Its western boundary is Puget Sound and the eastern boundaries of Seattle and Tukwila.

Seattle District

This district is composed of Seattle, Burien, White Center, and part of Boulevard Park.

Kent District

This is the south King County district, with some of northern Pierce county to supply the population shortfall in King County. Its eastern border includes 276th Ave, Kanaskat-Kangley Rd, Cumberland-Kanasket Rd, and Weyerhaeuser Mainline Rd.

Principal components of the boundary in Pierce County are the southern boundary of Buckley, SR 162, the eastern boundary of Orting, the southern boundary of Puyallup, SR 512, and the eastern boundary of Tacoma.
