

General Boundary Description in Divided Counties

In King County, begin at the boundary of Kittitas County. Go west on Interstate 90, north on SR 202, and north on SR 203 to the boundary of Snohomish County. Cities divided by these highways, North Bend, Snoqualmie, Carnation and Duvall are all included in the proposed district.

In Snohomish County, begin at the boundary of King County. Continue north on SR 203, to the southern boundary of Monroe. Follow the southern boundary of Monroe to its easternmost point. Go more or less due north to a point just west of the Pilchuck River south of Granite Falls (unfortunately, there is no road or other physical feature which can easily define this portion of the boundary). Go west to 163rd Ave NE and then north. Go north on 163rd Ave NE and west and north on Burn Road, continuing north on the South Fork of the Stillaguamish River and following the river to Interstate 5. Go south on Interstate 5 then west on Pioneer Highway to its intersection with the boundary between Lakewood and Arlington School Districts. Continue along the boundary between Arlington and Stanwood-Camano School Districts on the north and Lakewood and Marysville School Districts on the south to Island County. This proposed district includes Granite Falls and Warm Beach, but does not include Monroe or Arlington.



Description of Proposed Districts

Generally speaking, the proposed Bellingham district is composed of the city of Bellingham and that part of Whatcom county north of Bellingham and west of Guide Meridian Rd.

Generally speaking, the proposed Mount Vernon district is composed of those portions of Whatcom and Skagit counties east of Guide Meridian Road, east of Bellingham, east of I-5 between Bellingham and Burlington, east of the western boundaries of Burlington and Mount Vernon, and, south of Mount Vernon, east of the current boundary between the 10th and 39th districts.

Generally speaking, the proposed Oak Harbor district is composed of Island and San Juan counties, that part of Skagit county, west of I-5, west of Burlington and Mount Vernon, and, south of Mount Vernon, west of the current boundary between the 10th and 39th districts, and that part of Whatcom county south of Bellingham and west of I-5.
