


**PROPOSED CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT**

### General Boundary Description in Divided Counties

The only divided county in this proposed district is King county. The small population of King county in this district is located in a mountainous and forested area in the southeast of the county. The northern boundary is I-90. The western boundary includes SR 18, 276<sup>th</sup> Ave, Kanaskat-Kangley Rd, Cumberland-Kanasket Rd, and Weyerhaeuser Mainline Rd.





## Description of Proposed Districts

Generally speaking, the proposed Richland district is composed of Benton county, except Kennewick and neighboring unincorporated areas, and that part of Yakima county generally east of Granger and between the firing range and the Yakima river. This combines all of the agricultural areas of Benton county with neighboring agricultural areas in eastern Yakima county. The district is split about equally between Richland-Hanford and these agricultural areas.

Generally speaking, the proposed Kennewick district is composed of the city of Kennewick, some adjacent unincorporated areas and 95% of the population of the city of Pasco (56,969 persons out of 59,881). This district is overwhelmingly urban, allowing the nearby agricultural areas to be in districts much less urban than they presently are.

Generally speaking, the proposed Moses Lake district is composed of Adams and Lincoln counties, the southeastern part of Grant county, and that part of Spokane county north of the Union Pacific railroad and south of Hallett Road to the airport and Thorpe Road west of the airport, and all of Franklin county outside the city of Pasco, and a small part of the city of Pasco. This combines all of the agricultural areas of Franklin county into a single district with similar agricultural areas of counties to the north.
