


PROPOSED CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Comments on Proposed Congressional District

This district is the only one I am proposing which is composed only of whole counties and is formed entirely within the boundaries of a current congressional district.


This district is also the smallest in population in the state. The overall range in population of the districts which I have offered is from 669,847 to 673,002, a range of 3,155 persons. The Supreme Court's rule of thumb for "as nearly equal as is practicable" is 1%, which in the case of Washington in 2010, would be 6,724 persons. So, this proposal for congressional districts utilizes only 47% of the overall range allowed by the Supreme Court. This range is allowed for the purpose of enabling the satisfaction of other legitimate state objectives, such as otherwise unnecessary divisions of counties. And that is the purpose of its use in this case.




**EASTERN WASHINGTON

Description of Proposed Districts within Spokane County

Generally speaking, the proposed Moses Lake district in Spokane county is that area north of the Union Pacific railroad and south of Hallett Road to Fairchild Air Force Base and Thorpe Road west of the air base. It includes Cheney and Medical Lake.

Generally speaking, the proposed Omak district in Spokane county is the panhandle part of Spokane county. It includes Deer Park, Green Bluff and Mount Spokane.

Generally speaking, the proposed Spokane South district is entirely within the city of Spokane. West of Division, it includes everything south of Wellesley. East of Division, the boundary stairsteps down until the east city limit is reached on Liberty Avenue. The area east of Havana in the area of Parkwater and Felts Field is not included in this district.

Generally speaking, the proposed Spokane North district includes the remainder of the city of Spokane, and the nearby areas outside the city on the north, the west and the south, including the city of Airway Heights. Other communities included in this district are Town and Country, Countryside, Fairwood and Mead and Fairchild Air Force Base.

Generally speaking, the proposed Spokane Valley district includes the cities of Spokane Valley, Liberty Lake and Millwood. It includes all of the East Valley and Central Valley School Districts and all of the West Valley School District except for the part which is in the city of Spokane. It also includes that part of the Spokane School District east of the city of Spokane in and south of the city of Spokane Valley. And it includes the eastern three-quarters of that part of the Freeman School District north of Elder Road.

Generally speaking, the proposed Walla Walla district in Spokane county is the part of the county which is considered to be part of the Palouse. The district boundary in Spokane county is generally the Union Pacific Railroad on the west, Anderson and Paradise roads in the center, and Elder Road on the east. This results in the removal of the urbanized area of Spokane county from the district and drops the district population in Spokane county from 29,682 in the current 9th district to 5,399 in the proposed district.
