

Description of Proposed Districts

The proposed Centralia district is composed of parts of Lewis, Pierce and Thurston counties. In Pierce county, the district includes an area south of Joint Base Lewis-McChord including the city of Roy. In Thurston county, the district includes all of the county southeast of Interstate 5, except the cities of Tumwater, Olympia and Lacey, and some suburban areas south and east of Tumwater and Lacey. In Lewis county, the district includes everything west of Interstate 5 and north of SR 6, more or less Pleasant Valley Road and Avery Road. East of Interstate 5, it includes everything north of US 12 to the Cowlitz river bridge, east of Mossyrock, then everything north of the Cowlitz River and everything east of the boundary between the Mossyrock and White Pass school districts. The cities of Pe Ell, bisected by SR 6, and Mossyrock, bisected by US 12, are not within this district.

The proposed Longview district is composed of Cowlitz and Wahkiakum counties and part of Clark and Lewis counties. The area of Lewis county within the district is the area excluded from the Centralia district, and includes the cities of Pe Ell and Mossyrock. In western Clark county, the district includes the Woodland school district and that part of the LaCenter school district north of a boundary composed generally of 389th street, 41st avenue, and 339th street. In central Clark county, it includes the Green Mountain school district and that part of the Battle Ground school district north of 339th street. In eastern Clark county it includes the Battle Ground school district north of the East Fork Lewis River.
