



**SOUTH CENTRAL

Description of Proposed Districts

Generally speaking, the proposed Toppenish district is composed of Klickitat and Skamania counties and all of Yakima county except for the city of Yakima, the area north of Yakima and east of the Yakima river and the area east of Granger and between the firing range and the Yakima river.

Generally speaking, the proposed Yakima district is composed of Kittitas county, the city of Yakima and that part of Yakima county north of the city of Yakima and east of the Yakima river including the firing range. This is basically an upper Yakima river district. In the context of central Washington, Kittitas county can hardly be considered an agricultural county. The value of its agricultural production in 2007 was about 5% of the value in Yakima and Grant counties. It is the only county in the state in which the product providing the highest value is hay. While Kittitas county and the city of Yakima undoubtedly have significant agricultural interests, there are a lot of other things going on in both places which differentiate them from the agricultural regions adjacent to them. A majority of the population of Kittitas county lives in the greater Ellensburg area, which is only half as far from Yakima as it is from Moses Lake.

Generally speaking, the proposed Richland district is composed of Benton county, except Kennewick and neighboring unincorporated areas, and that part of Yakima county generally east of Granger and between the firing range and the Yakima river. This combines all of the agricultural areas of Benton county with neighboring agricultural areas in eastern Yakima county. The district is split about equally between Richland-Hanford and these agricultural areas. .
