As I pondered these questions I realized that the best use of this new 10th district is to spread its newness as far and wide throughout our state. How can we give every one the power and spirit of a new 10th district?

A State where level headed voters consider the issues of the day before them with transparency, balance and privacy.



A State that assures every voter an equal stake in our government.

A State that through calm minds agreeing on the best procedures to achieve a common good that evolved enough to create this very decennial districting process.




"WE" PLAN CONGRESSIONAL

My process was to organize the state into four natural channels: Peninsula/Puget Sound, I-5 West, I-5 East and Eastern Washington. Then sequentially drawing districts using one contiguous line through these natural channels until all 10 Congressional and 49 Legislative Districts were drawn. I only used precincts and not blocks so the actual numbers are not perfect...but from my understanding would stand up to a court challenge. It's the principle behind creating this kind of structure that is the point of this proposal. After I finished the Legislative map Linnea, my wife said it looks like the word "WE" so that's where the name comes from.




I-5 West




I-5 East

The reason that redistricting is controversial elsewhere is that process is that and the process is overly partisan and open to manipulation by special interests. In 1981 our state made great strides in evolving the process of reassigning of voters creating a redistricting commission that functions independent of the legislature. Certainly, the associated interests of voters will still be expressed through the practice of this plan but those interests of partisanship will not be what designs the plan. The forces of partisanship and grassroots organizing belong in our campaigns, debates and political fundraising. But they do not belong in the physical foundation of our democracy that is district lines. Partisan and activist groups are forever fluctuating but the proposed hard boundaries of the Puget Sound, Interstate 5 and the Cascade Mountains, in the WE PLAN are not.



73% of Washington's citizens live within 25 miles of Interstate 5 making it the most logical line in which to organize districts.

This plan hopes to further the goals, wisdom and spirit that originally created a Redistricting Commission that functions independent of the legislature. By overtly designing populist districts you will express a culture and state that is dedicated to transparency and with voters understanding the district shapes and the boundaries, purpose and rational of the lines drawn.

The WE PLAN offers empirical evidence to voters that fairness is a fundamental organizing principal of in Washington State's elections by presenting a rational for districting decisions instead of keeping mysterious an already skewed structure of political representation.

The WE PLAN offers a strong districting structure. By relying more heavily on the natural geography and sequential numbering that voters will easily understand, navigate and identify our physical/political landscape resulting in a more engaged unified and empowered citizenry and State.

Using this strong structure will make it easier for you the commissioners to deliberate and defend the 2011 Districting plan. As well as set a strong precedence for future districting commissions to follow.

The visual and numerical rationality built our political system...being further amplified by the power and spirit of a new district will shared by all voters across our great State.

Minority Majority Districting

By utilizing preexisting non-changeable structures as organizing principles in the districting process like: natural geographic channels, sequential numbering, colorblindness, equal districts sizes that follow a contiguous line through the geography of our state issues about racial disproportionality become moot due to a transparency and rationality in districting.

Gerrymandering should be avoided at all costs. Because it's the use of gerrymandering that opens the doors for legitimate cases of Minority discrimination. The Commission should adamantly reject all proposals to gerrymander. For the franchise of democratic voting is not to be an expression of race rather it is an expression of citizenship the role that we all hold in common.

The WE plan asks the Commission to explicitly and intentionally refuse to gerrymander in anyway shape or form. All districting injustices happen when states choose to district using gerrymandering. Administering injustice is what gerrymandering is design to do.

If the Commission does chooses to profile voters and rely on the partisan forces of national parties and minority activist groups the commission threatens to undermine the very idea of what it means to be a state. By seeking to divide our government instead of uniting it... As well as ignoring the instructions from it's legislative mandate to not favor any one group or political interest.

The purpose of our state should be to unify our citizens and engaging them toward a more deliberative form of self governance. I fear that if the commission pursues a profiling/separating fashion of districting they are in fact leading our state farther down the pipelines of demagoguery into the echo chambers of submission. And will make our state and Nation even more stuck, with more distrust of our fellow citizens, inconceivable debts, unstoppable wars and lack of ability to agree with our neighbors.

The WE Plan might not empower the voice of our political parties or make our elections cheaper efficient and easier to manage...that's the point. Please give Washington State competitive elections in every district for every voter.
